"We all work for money, but we also work to feel good about ourselves. There is a direct relationship between the severity of your disability and your level of loneliness," Community Options, Inc. Founder, President and CEO Robert Stack said in a recent interview on WPRB-Princeton. "For people with disabilities, the way you find friends is usually through work. I felt that by getting people with disabilities jobs in community, they would have a chance to form relationships with other people. They did and our entrepreneurial business thrived."

The Daily Plan It has been open since 1998. Some of the services provided to the tenants include professional receptionist services, clerical support, high-speed color copying, graphic design for branding and stationery as well as on-site concierge services including dry cleaning pick up and delivery. Employees receive valuable work experience in areas such as customer service, inventory management, quality and database management, as well as facilities maintenance. The Daily Plan It has locations in Morristown, Princeton and Moorestown, NJ and Dallas, Texas.
