U.S. Air Force Chaplain, Lt. Col. Bruce R. Glover, a 1982 Princeton Seminary graduate, spoke during the school's recent Military Chaplains Day, a program held each Veterans Day to honor both current and past chaplains in the armed services.

He offered thanks, prayer, and reflections from his 25 years of service. "I urge you to make time this Veterans Day to respond to Jesus' invitation to follow him by giving your life away in love and peace," he said. "Jesus showed us what it means to lay down one's life in love. For what, or whom would you be willing to lay down your life?" He asked people to remember those who gave their lives throughout the 20th century, which was "the bloodiest century of all human history; 43 million military personnel and 63 million civilians died due to war."

He is studying for a master's degree from the Institute for Conflict Analysis and Resolution at George Mason University in Washington, D.C. Previously, he was stationed at Osan Air Base in South Korea for two years, serving as the wing chaplain, 51st Fighter Wing. The Seminary has a long history of preparing men and women who become military chaplains. During the past 200 years, hundreds of alumni have served the military in battles and on bases worldwide. Today, there are 850 military chaplains in America's armed forces, and nearly 14 percent are Princeton Seminary graduates.
