NJ Senatorial Nominee Bob Hugin Visits Community Options

PRINCETON, NJ (August 24, 2018) – Yesterday, New Jersey Senatorial nominee Bob Hugin visited nonprofit Community Options' Daily Plan It in Princeton, NJ.

The Daily Plan It (DPI) is a Community Options Enterprises' business which was created to train and employ people with disabilities. It is a complete office, conference and copy center that offers furnished office rental space or virtual tenancy to a variety of businesses. The DPI gives individuals with developmental and intellectual disabilities an opportunity to earn minimum wage or better, learn new skills and find employment in the community with their new skill set.

Hugin spent time interacting with the individuals supported, the Community Options staff as well as touring and learning how the Daily Plan It operates.

"I greatly enjoyed my visit to Community Options in Princeton today to see the incredible work they are doing for people with developmental disabilities," said Hugin. "It was impressive to see how many real world opportunities are made accessible for their participants to live an engaged and productive life."

Hugin is the Republican nominee for U.S. Senate in New Jersey for the 2018 election, after he announced his candidacy in February. Hugin served several years in the U.S. Marine Corps and was an executive J.P. Morgan and Celgene. Hugin graduated from Princeton University with a BA and the University of Virginia with an MBA.
